SAMPLE WILL LANGUAGE

The Foundation provides Will Language examples to support reviewing a legacy gift with your professional advisor. Whether you are leaving a general or specific purpose bequest to the Foundation, we provide the following Will language to be reviewed with your lawyer.

Our legal name is Hospitals of Regina Foundation Inc. and our charitable registration number is #119114056RR0001.

General Purpose Bequest

Bequests received by the Hospitals of Regina Foundation Inc. for general purposes are applied in accordance with the policies of the Board of Directors, having regard for the fulfillment of the donor's wishes and the needs of the Foundation. Such gifts may be made by way of cash, specified property or some or all the residue of an estate.

Sample Will language for general bequests are as follows:

"To deliver, pay or transfer (the sum of \$_____);

Specific Purpose Bequest

The Hospitals of Regina Foundation may also receive bequests for specific purposes. It is recommended that donors seeking to arrange such gifts confirm with the Foundation's Legacy Giving personnel that the intended purpose is appropriate and shall be suitably expressed for the future of the gift. *(See Power to vary clause below).*

Sample Will Language for specific bequests are as follows:

Power to Vary Clause recommended for all specific bequests

If, at my death, the purpose to which I have designated my gift to the Hospitals of Regina Foundation Inc. is no longer feasible in the opinion of its Board of Directors ("the Board"), I authorize the Board to alter the purpose to a purpose that they, in their discretion, consider most closely fulfills my bequest.
